2014/2015 BEA Parent-Child Reading Programme Kicks Off

Hong Kong, 14th October, 2014 – The Bank of East Asia, Limited ("BEA") announces that The Bank of East Asia Charitable Foundation Limited ("BEA Foundation") is serving as title sponsor of the BEA Parent-Child Reading Programme (the "Programme") organised by Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui's Religious Education Resource Centre ("RERC") for a second consecutive year.

Over 200 students, parents, and teachers attended the kick-off ceremony, held on Saturday, 11th October, 2014 at BEA Tower in Kwun Tong. Speaking at the event, Mr. Brian Li, Executive Director & Deputy Chief Executive of BEA and Director of the BEA Foundation, said, "In view of the overwhelming response to the Programme last year, we have decided not only to increase the number of openings from 1,200 to 2,000, but also to introduce a "train the trainer" workshop with an aim to equip more parents, librarians, and teachers with the skills necessary to foster good reading habits among children."

The Rev. Dr. Canon Thomas Pang, Director of RERC, who also attended the ceremony, said "A special emphasis of this project is to promote parent - child interaction. Emilie Buchwald, an author of two award-winning children's books in the US said, 'Children are made readers on the laps of their parents.' We hope that we will be able to encourage and support parents in building a strong foundation for their children's lifelong learning through reading."

The Programme will continue to target Primary 1 to Primary 6 school students from families receiving Comprehensive Social Security Assistance or student financial assistance. After paying an enrolment fee of just HK\$30 to join the Programme, each participant will receive up to six carefully selected books that deal with a variety of topics, such as peace, introspection, and persistence. Instructional material including suggestions on how to read the books with their children will also be provided to parents, with an aim to help them strengthen their relationships with their children.

Throughout its history spanning nearly 100 years, BEA has supported a wide range of charitable programmes and events in the communities it serves. In 2009, the Bank established the BEA Foundation in support of education and to help alleviate the burdens of underprivileged members of society.
