### The BEA Foundation Continues Its Commitment to Education

Sponsors the BEA Parent-Child Reading Programme for the Fourth Consecutive Year

**Hong Kong, 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2016 –** The Bank of East Asia, Limited ("BEA") announces the commencement of the 2016/2017 BEA Parent-Child Reading Programme ("the Programme"). Funded by BEA's charitable arm, The Bank of East Asia Charitable Foundation ("BEA Foundation"), the Programme is organised by Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui's Religious Education Resource Centre ("RERC") and receives volunteer support and other forms of assistance from the BEA. This is the fourth consecutive year that the BEA Foundation has served as the title sponsor of the Programme.

Over the years, interest in the BEA Parent-Child Reading Programme has grown considerably. In comparison with the 2013/2014 Programme, which involved just over 40 schools and 1,200 children, the 2015/2016 Programme involved more than 100 schools and 2,400 children.

Commenting on the Programme, Ms. Mimi Kam, General Manager and Head of Human Resources & Corporate Communications Division of BEA and Director of the BEA Foundation, stated "We are truly pleased to have the opportunity to support an initiative that not only supports our commitment to education, but also fosters stronger bonds between children and their parents, which is beneficial to our society as a whole."

The Rev. Dr. Canon Thomas Pang, Director of RERC, said "The programme is effective in enhancing student engagement and their motivation to read, as well as promoting children's character development and parent-child relationships."

The Programme has been designed for kindergarten and primary school students, including those from families receiving Comprehensive Social Security Assistance. After paying an enrolment fee, participants receive four to eight selected books and instructional materials. To help parents and teachers learn more about how to foster good reading habits among children, participating adults can take part in the "Train the Trainer" workshop, which was first introduced to the Programme in 2014.

Throughout its history spanning nearly 100 years, BEA has supported a wide range of charitable programmes and events in the communities it serves. In 2009, the Bank established the BEA Foundation in support of education, and to help alleviate the burdens of underprivileged members of society.
