Inaugural “Beyond Environmental Arts Festival”
*offers free, fun theatrical performance,
creative art workshops and installation art exhibitions*



Hong Kong, 11th July, 2022 – The Bank of East Asia, Limited (“BEA” or the “Bank”) announces the debut of its “Beyond Environmental Arts Festival” (“BEA Festival”) in July, organised alongside the Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation (“HKYAF”). Through a series of fun, engaging activities with this year’s theme of “Waste Not, Want Not”, the BEA Festival aims to raise public awareness of environmental protection, promote sustainable living to the next generation, and demonstrate how small changes to our everyday lives can make a huge difference to our planet.

All activities, to be held on two consecutive weekends in July, are **free of charge** and suitable for persons aged 5 and above. Activities include an original theatrical performance “Time4Change”, creative art workshops and installation art exhibitions.

Through an internal recycling campaign, BEA staff contributed over 2,200 pieces of old clothing, plastic and different materials for the creative art workshops. Besides promoting environmental protection, another focus of BEA Festival is to support young local artists. This year, young creators have come together to collaborate with about a hundred BEA volunteers and youth participants to deliver refreshing art pieces, of which four will be displayed at the venue during the event period for photo-taking.

Activities

Original Theatrical Performance “Time4Change”

As we go about our daily lives, we all produce waste – much more than we imagine! What can we do to make a difference and help protect the environment? Maybe it is time to make some changes!

Written and directed by Lindsey McAlister, the Founder of HKYAF, “Time4Change” is an original, high-energy family-friendly theatrical performance about five young environmental activists who speak up for our planet. Join them on their quest for change and inspire young people to make choices that can save our planet now and for future generations.



“Reclaimed Wood Coasters” Workshop

Every day, hundreds of tonnes of discarded wooden pallets are sent to landfills in Hong Kong.

In this workshop, art instructors from The Warehouse Teenage Club will work with participants to cut, sand, wax and assemble reclaimed wood pieces to create cool and useful upcycled coasters, and at the same time, relieve the burden on the environment.



“Miniature Fabric Dolls” Workshop

Fast fashion items may be cheap to buy but the planet pays a significant price.

Artist Eva Cheng will demonstrate how old clothing can be upcycled into fabric doll charms. Participants are encouraged to bring along two pieces of recycled cotton cloth (20x20cm)—and fabric scraps of any size or material for making the doll’s body—to the workshop. Small items such as buttons, zips or ribbons are also welcome for decoration purposes. Together, we will upcycle your old clothing into an accessory. Don’t forget to think twice before you buy new clothes next time!



“Paper Porcupine Puppets” Workshop

Everyone loves online shopping, but our click-to-buy habits generate tonnes of packaging waste. Besides shopping selectively, what can you do to help reduce or recycle this waste?

Artist Candice Keung will show participants how to make a fun porcupine rod puppet from thin cardboard sheets, waste paper and a straw. Participants are encouraged to bring along a thin A4-size cardboard sheet, 5 recycled magazine pages or food packaging boxes and a straw to the workshop.



“Plastic Insect Pins” Workshop

According to some studies, if nothing is done to reduce plastic pollution, 99% of marine species will consume microplastics by 2050 and the effect on the food chain and human health could be devastating.

Artist Yui Wong will work with participants to upcycle plastic spoons and pieces of transparent plastic with beads, twist ties and acrylic paint pens into colourful ladybirds and dragonflies. The workshop aims to inspire participants to consider the impact we have on the environment in everyday life and minimise the use of plastic. Participants are encouraged to bring along a plastic spoon and thin clear plastic sheets to the workshop.
