

# Celebration of the 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Palliative Care for the Elderly Programme cum Symposium on Palliative Support

Building a Compassionate Community by Attending to the Needs of the Elderly in their Golden Years

**Hong Kong, 13 May 2025** – Sponsored by "la Caixa" Foundation and The Bank of East Asia Charitable Foundation Limited ("BEA Foundation"), the Palliative Care for the Elderly Programme (or "Programme") organised by The Salvation Army celebrated its 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary today, and hosted the "Cultivating Compassion: Symposium on Palliative Support in Hong Kong." This event brought together government officials, representatives from healthcare and welfare sectors, as well as industry leaders to explore innovative strategies for end-of-life care, and to foster a compassionate community culture.

Mr Chris Sun Yuk-han, JP, Secretary for Labour and Welfare of The Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region stated, "The Government attaches great importance to the elderly care services, including providing end-of-life care for elderly people in need. My heartfelt gratitude goes to The Salvation Army, BEA Foundation, and "la Caixa" Foundation for their unfailing support on this front. With their contributions, the Programme, launched in 2010, has continued to offer comprehensive care for elderly people in their final stages of life".

Mr Marc Simón Martínez, Deputy Director of Social Programs of "la Caixa" Foundation, said "As we celebrate the 15th anniversary of the Programme today, we honor the shared vision that has evolved into a compassionate, community-based service model. This dedication not only humanises end-of-life processes but also reflects our foundation's support for the development of palliative care in Hong Kong".

Mr Adrian Li Man-kiu, BBS, JP, Co-Chief Executive of The Bank of East Asia and Director of BEA Foundation said, "We are pleased to see that the Programme has made notable achievements over the past 15 years. It has supported over 3,000

elders and their families, trained more than 10,000 elderly care practitioners, and provided life education and consultation service to around 45,000 members of the public. We have also worked with residential care homes to increase awareness of the needs of terminally ill patients, published guidelines and practice manuals for appropriate end-of-life care, and provided legislative recommendations and references to the Government regarding the choice of dying-in-place. A policy change was implemented in June 2024 to facilitate the choice of dying-in-place for terminally ill patients in residential care homes. This represents a major milestone in our collaboration".

Colonel Philip Maxwell, Territorial Commander, The Salvation Army Hong Kong and Macau Territory emphasised, "Looking ahead, we will prioritise compassion in promoting more comprehensive end-of-life care services for the elderly. This is not just a social responsibility but also a cultural legacy that ensures every elder receives respect and care".

Today's symposium covered a variety of topics including practice experiences on dying-in-place cases, legislative progress on "Advance Medical Directives," as well as strategies for promoting volunteer participation. Speakers at the symposium also called for the broadening of palliative care services to a wider community level, and encouraged all parties to participate and promote initiatives that provide the elderly with more opportunities for self-directed life planning, ensuring their lives in the later stages are full of dignity and choice.


